

## More With Fotoflexer and BeFunky

1. Go to [www.fotoflexer.com](http://www.fotoflexer.com)
2. A fun thing to do is change the background of a subject. Let's take an object and put it into a different background.
3. Open a photo with an object in it that you want to cut out and place in another background.
4. Now click on the *Smart Scissors* tool on the *Geek* tab. It is the middle tool in the tool palette. We can use this tool to select any shape we want from our picture. Sometimes it helps to zoom in on your picture to see the edges of the object you want to cut out more clearly. Now click on an edge of the object you're cutting out and move slightly to the left and click again on the edge. You should notice a line connecting the two points. It follows the color edges in the picture. If it didn't follow the edge of your object, you can *Undo* and try clicking on the edge again so it matches up better.
5. Continue clicking around the object until you have connected the first square to the last dot. The square will turn green when you complete the trip around your object. After you make the selection, it will dim the rest of your picture and outline the area you selected in red.
6. Click *Create Cutout*.
7. Now click on the Layers tab.
8. Click on *Add Images* and then *Edit From My Computer* to open the picture you'd like to use as the new background for your object.
9. Now you can drag both the background and your object around to place them how you want them. If your background picture is on top of your object, you can click on *Push Back* or *Pull Forward* in order to change the order of your layers.
10. Once it is set-up how you'd like it, click outside the selection to anchor the object into its position in the picture.
11. Save this as "object\_newbg.jpg" in your folder.
12. Go to [www.befunky.com](http://www.befunky.com)
13. Click on *Get started Now!*
14. Click on *Scribbler*.
15. Then click on Browse Files and open one of your landscape pictures.
16. If you'd like, you can rotate or crop the picture using tools right away. Do whatever you need to do here and choose either *Ok* or *Skip Editing*.
17. Your photo will load with one of the Scribbler variations applied. Click on *more options* to tweak the settings to make the picture look how you'd like it.
18. Once you're satisfied with your picture, click the blue Save button in the upper right. Name the image "funky1.jpg" and click Save to my desktop. Be sure you save it into the correct folder!
19. Click on Goodies at the bottom of the window to show some other things you can add to your photos. Try out some Frames, Shapes, Graphic Text, etc.
20. Play around with these and other settings and tools. Save three more pictures as "funky2.jpg", "funky3.jpg", and "funky4.jpg".
21. Use the things we've learned so far to edit your landscape pictures. Using any of the websites we're looked at so far. For example, try pasting a person into a totally different environment. Have some fun!
