

## Adding Pictures to Your Webpage

1. Open index.html and links.html in SeaMonkey Composer.
2. Go to [www.hasslefreeclipart.com](http://www.hasslefreeclipart.com) in your web browser.
3. Click on **Sports** on the left-hand side.
4. Choose any picture that you like and click on it.
5. This will bring up a larger version of the picture.
6. Right-click on the picture and click *Save Picture As...*
7. Navigate to your folder and save the picture with the filename "sports.gif" in your folder.
8. The picture file is now saved on the hard drive ready to be inserted into a webpage. Go to your index.html page.
9. Find a spot that you want to put the picture and put your blinking cursor there.
10. Click on the *Image* button in the toolbar at the top.
11. This brings up a dialog box asking us to choose an image to insert. Click on the *Choose File...* button.
12. If it doesn't already show you the pictures in your folder, navigate there. You should see the picture we just saved "sports.gif". Click on it and then click *Open*.
13. In the **Alternate text:** box type "Sports Picture". This is the text that will show up when someone puts his or her mouse over the picture. You can fill in anything you want, or you don't have to put anything. Alt. text is nice to use as a description of what is in the picture, especially for someone with a slower internet connection, or to provide more information about what's in the picture.
14. Click *Ok*. A box for the picture should now show up where you inserted it.
15. Format the picture to your liking. Remember you can center it just like you can text.
16. Go to [www.gifs.net](http://www.gifs.net)
17. Look through the pictures on this website. Notice how they are moving. These are called animated gifs. Pick one you like and follow the same process you used above to insert it into your webpage. Remember, save it to your folder, insert image, type in alt text, and then format the picture however you like. When it shows up on your page it won't be animated, but don't worry it will be when it's up on your website.
18. SAVE!!
19. We can also use pictures as links. Select the second picture you put onto your webpage and right-click on it. Choose *Create Link...*
20. Enter a website URL that deals with the subject of your picture. For example, if I put a baseball, I might link it to <http://www.mlb.com>
21. Click *Ok*. Now when someone clicks on that picture it will take them to the website that you linked it to.
22. Save!!
23. Select "Contact" in your navigation table.
24. Right-click on it and select *Create Link...*
25. In the **Link Location** box type "mailto:fillinyouremailhere". This creates a link that will allow someone that visits your webpage to send you an email. Click *Ok*.
26. Make sure you change it on all the navigation tables you have on your website.

27. Save!!
28. Login to your FreeHostingCloud account and upload all of the files in your folder, including the pictures!
29. Make sure you double-check all the links you put on your page to be sure they work properly. Also make sure the pictures you put on your site show up. If all you see is a blank box with a little x in it, that probably means you forgot to upload the picture, or something is wrong with your link. Anytime you make any changes to your page you need to upload the updated file to the server. You only need to upload pictures once, unless, of course, you change them.
30. Often websites provide embed codes that allow you to put a video or many other things from their site onto your site.
31. Go to [www.cnn.com/video](http://www.cnn.com/video)
32. Find a video you think is interesting. Hold your mouse over it and click on the “Share” button in the upper right hand corner.
33. Click on the third button that looks like this: `</>` to bring up the embed code.
34. Click “Copy embed” on the right to copy the html code to place the video on your page.
35. Go to `index.html` and click on the `<HTML> Source` button at the bottom.
36. Find the line that starts `<table style=` and paste the embed code right before it. You won’t be able to see the video yet.
37. Save and upload `index.html` to see the embedded video on your page.

40. Next will be your chance to do anything you want to your website. You can add links, pictures, that story or poem you wrote that you’ve wanted to share with the world, your opinions on the newest movie or video game, or anything else you’d like to put on your website. I will do my best to help you do whatever you’re interested in. Your assignment before next time is to please make sure you have some ideas about what you’d like to put onto your site so that you don’t spend the whole class time looking around trying to figure out what you’d like to do!
